"UMAMI" Matthew 5:13-16 June 11, 2017

INTRODUCTION:

Unless you are an avid watcher of cooking show - or have a good knowledge of culinary arts - - you may not be familiar with the word "umami."

Technically, umami the fifth basic taste, a taste that goes beyond sweet, sour, bitter and salty. It was "discovered" by the Japanese.

Umami is that other thing in food, the thing that sets one dish apart from the same dish prepared with a certain "something" in it.

It's the thing you didn't even know needed a concept or a name until someone pointed it out.

It's that taste that is a perfect balance between boldness and harmony; the taste that leaves you craving more.

A personal example.

While serving a church in rural East Texas, someone talked me into entering jalapeno jelly in the county fair.

I did - and I won a blue ribbon.

The only difference between my jelly and all the others was an ingredient known as "yerba anise" -

- Mexican mint marigold.

There was not enough in the jar to change the taste just enough to enhance the flavor already there something that set it apart from all the others without being identified on its own.

Now . . . we were not called together for a cooking lesson and I would not be the one to teach it if we were.

So, let's look at how Jesus is calling us to be the "salt" of the earth, Jesus is calling us to be the "umami" in the world.

Let me explain.

WORSHIP:

Have you ever walked out of a worship service and the sun seems just a little brighter?

There's a sense of peace and well-being you haven't felt in a while?

You feel as though God was really present?

Sure you have.

Now . . . what set <u>that</u> worship service apart from all the others? Was it the music?

Was it the sermon?

Was it the way the worship service flowed?

I know what you are about to answer:
It was the Holy Spirit.
Right?

Trust me when I tell you that the Holy Spirit is present in almost <u>every</u> worship service -

- no matter how good or bad you may perceive it to be.

But there was <u>something</u> in that worship service that set it apart from all the others...

... there was spiritual "umami" in that worship. And you recognize it - but can't describe it.

SERVICE:

OK ... set that thought aside for a moment.

Have you ever performed an act of service that left you feeling good about what you just did? Of course you have.

Even if it was tossing an extra check into the offering plate or giving up an hour or two to mow the church lawn or staying after coffee on Sunday to help clean up.

Or putting up or taking down decorations in the Church.

What set that act of service apart from all the others? That's even tougher to describe, isn't it?

How many times have you given a little extra and <u>not</u> had that special feeling?
Or mowed the lawn or washed dishes
And it was just service as usual; duty, if you will.

That difference, my friends, is "umami" - spiritual "umami."

INDIVIDUALLY:

Now, let's get personal with things.

Jesus calls us to be "umami" in th world

- especially the immediate world around us.

Oh, I know the words in the Bible don't <u>say</u> umami - it says "salt."

But in my soul,

I believe Jesus was calling us to be umami in the world -

- that certain difficult to describe difference
 - that distinguishes a committed Christian from the rest of the world.

If you have never spent time in a cardiac ward, trying to survive on a "heart healthy" diet, you may not fully understand the role salt plays in food.

Salt can turn a pile of mashed potatoes from library paste to something edible.

Lack of salt can turn a pork chop into shoe leather.

So Jesus says to each of us . . . be something *more*!

When you talk to your neighbors, let the light of Christ shine through your words, your expressions, your actions.

Let the joy of your salvation leak out of every pore in your body so that those around you will *feel* the difference Jesus has made in your life.

Jesus says: You are salt - be flavorful - use that salt to make the Gospel irresistible.

Jesus says: You are the light in the world -

- be a beacon to those who seek the peace and faith that each of us has found.

Be umami!

Notice, Jesus didn't ask you - and neither do I -

- to hound these folks with scripture or Bible tracts -
 - or the threat of eternal damnation.

Neither does Jesus say: Just be yourselves.

What Jesus says is: Be umami!

Let me give you a better illustration.

Just up the road, they have opened up a new restaurant. And the food there is absolutely magnificent!

The menu is not extensive -

- they prefer to concentrate on making a few items excellent rather than making a lot of food mediocre.

Someone invites you to join them for dinner.

And you are both excited and a little apprehensive.

When you get there, the atmosphere is inviting, The wait-staff is attentive.

And the food . . . it is simply the best meal you've had

in a very, very long time.

Now, your friends who invited you didn't cook that meal.

They merely invited you to a place they trusted would serve your meal with a HUGE portion of umami!

BACK TO WORSHIP:

Now . . . remember earlier when we were talking about worship?

And I said there was <u>something</u> in that worship service
that set it apart from all the others . . .

... there was spiritual "umami" in that worship. And you recognize it - but can't describe it.

What do you suppose that umami is?

The choir? No - even though they are really, really good.

The preacher? I only wish I could take the credit.

The lighting?

The setting?

The Holy Spirit who is present in <u>every</u> worship service? Not just the presence of the Holy Spirit or every worship service would be great.

YOU!

You are what makes a worship service great.!

When you come to worship the One True God

- the One who loves you beyond measure
 - the One who shepherds you through dark times
 - the One who dances with you in the good times . . .

When <u>you</u> come expecting to meet <u>that</u> God, <u>you</u> bring the umami that makes all the difference.

Look, I know that sometimes it is all we can do
to bind our spiritual and emotional wounds
and crawl through the door of the church.
I've been there - and I'll probably be there again.

At those times,

I am blessed and fed by the umami in the room!
I am nourished by the love and care of each of you
- and the gathered "you" we call the church.

CONCLUSION:

Jesus said: "You are the salt of the earth . . . "You are the light of the world." (Mt. 5:13-14)

You have the opportunity given to you by God to make this Church great!

To fill every seat in this sanctuary!

To introduce someone to the Christ you follow!

You have the opportunity to be umami. May God bless and empower us!

You have called us, O God. You have equipped us. Now empower us and unleash us!
